



**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT
FOR CONTROL OF RED IMPORTED FIRE ANT IN POTTED PLANTS,
CONTAINERISED PLANTS AND ROOT-BALLED PLANTS.**

PERMIT NUMBER – PER13504

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. Product to be used:

LORSBAN 500 EC INSECTICIDE

NUFARM CHLORPYRIFOS 500 EC INSECTICIDE

PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 500 g/L CHLORPYRIFOS as their only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Crop	Pest	Rate
Potted plants, containerised plants and root-balled plants.	Red Imported Fire Ant (<i>Solenopsis invicta</i>)	30-40mL / 100 litres water.

Critical Use Comments:

- Apply mixture as a pot drench and water thoroughly.
- Alternatively, immerse pot completely in prepared dip.
- Fruit trees bearing fruit must have the fruit removed prior to treatment.

Warning:

Drenching may cause root damage on some plants. Prior to treating all plants undertake a test on a small sample of plants to satisfy that an unacceptable level of damage will not occur.

Jurisdiction:

QLD only.

Additional Conditions:

This Permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.
